YALE WINS AT TRAPS.

Takes Intercollegiate Shoot for 13th Time—Harvard Second.

NEW HAVEN, Conn., May 20.—For the thirteenth consecutive time the Yale Gun Club won the intercollegiate shoot this afternoon at the traps of the New Haven Gun Club. Some excellent shooting was done, Yale making 453 out of a possible 500. Other scores were: Yale 453, Harvard 447, Pennsylvania 445 and Princeton 426.

The individual championship, formerly held by Captain Gale of Yale, was won by A. B. Turner of Princeton with a score of 96, the highest intercollegiate

score yet made.

S. H. Blackmer of Yale was high gun, breaking 94 out of 100. Captain Gale came second with 93. C. P. Williams was third with 92. P. Boyle and J. G. Bennett had 91 and S3 respectively.
